



INTERPRETING POLICY

Auslan is the sign language of the Deaf community in Australia.

Deaf Advocacy, Sports and Recreation ACT (DeafACT) Inc. (ABN 25 826 092 369) believes that it is best practice to engage the services of Auslan/English interpreters and Deaf Interpreters (DI) who are certified by NAATI (the National Accreditation Authority for Translators and Interpreters) and who are current members of the professional body ASLIA (Australian Sign Language Interpreters Association). This practice ensures that interpreters engaged for work have been assessed to have the appropriate skills, are committed to ongoing professional development, and are engaged with current practice and research.

DeafACT will engage the services of Auslan/English and Deaf interpreters via an Auslan Booking agency to ensure that these interpreters are covered by the necessary workers compensation and professional indemnity and liability insurance cover.
